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NZHRA STREET ROD NATIONALS

The Street Rod Nationals are held once a year. At no time will the Association allow a conflict of dates with National events unless permission is granted by the National Event host club. It is therefore recommended that any Club anticipating staging such an event, contact their Zone Director at an early stage so that every assistance can be provided.

Host Clubs are required to furnish the NZHRA Executive with an audited Financial Report of any Street Rod Nationals within a period of six months after the close of the event and the NZHRA Executive has the discretion to make available these Financial Statements, along with a compendium of event planning and promotion to future hosts of the event if requested.

NZHRA has a maximum budget of \$5,000 with a maximum of \$120 per vehicle to be used to help entrants cross the Cook Straight to the Street Rod Nationals.

HOW TO RUN A NATIONAL EVENT

THE ORGANISING CLUB

To operate a Show successfully, include your Zone Director and the Committee should consist of:

- a) Event Manager
- b) Secretary
- c) Advertising and Promotion Supervisor
- d) Duties Co-coordinator
- e) Public Relations Supervisor

The following is an outline of the respective duties.

a) Event Manager

Is responsible for the direction of the event.

b) Secretary

A Secretary's job is always the same, but basically he/she should be competent in handling all correspondence required.

c) Advertising and Promotion Supervisor

The person who undertakes this position must know something about the field of advertising. He/she must have an active imagination and the drive required to make a success of the job. The success of the event lies largely with the effort put in by this person.

d) Duties Co-coordinator

Will be responsible for the planning of duties of the Club Members at the event (e.g. Manning of gates, ticket boxes, selling program, security etc).

e) Public Relations Officer

A most important person. He/she will be responsible for approaching companies etc to advertise and have trade displays at your event. Must be able to approach people with confidence, be articulate and have a pleasant personality and have a full grasp of the needs of the prospective sponsor and what the event has to offer.

NOTE: It is important that your Club President attends all meetings. He/she has the right to disagree on a proposal which may harm the Club's image and can exercise his/her casting vote.

You may have a main sponsor that wishes to have their name in the name of the event. This is ok but NZHRA **MUST** also be in the name, e.g.: 2023 Classic Cover Insurance NZHRA Street Rod Nationals or 2023 NZHRA Classic Cover Insurance Street Rod Nationals.

The Street Rod Nationals can be hosted by a Zone, however one club must sanction the event. Sanctioning of the event is required 18 months prior the date of the event. This gives all other clubs notice that the Street Rod Nationals has this particular date booked and to ensure there is no conflict of dates for other club events. An Event Safety Plan must be completed and approved before sanctioning can be completed. It must be adhered to and a copy should be available at all relevant events.

A full list of entrants must be sent to the NZHRA office to confirm entrant is a current financial member of NZHRA.

The host club can apply for up to a \$15,000 grant from NZHRA to help with costs. The request must be on Club letterhead (if a combined zone event, the request should come from the club that has sanctioned the event), signed by no less than three current affiliated club committee members, supply a projected budget and itinerary to show where the grant will be a benefit to the entrants of the event.

Things to consider:

1. Design t-shirts, poster and entry form
2. Driving and scrutineering events and forms to be organised along with safety plan
3. Arrange a site for the NZHRA to be available at a mutually satisfactory location
4. Club to provide transport to take entrants to places of interest in area while show is on
5. Prizegiving dinner and entertainment
6. Order keepsake trophies and 20 other awards for Top 10 Hot Rods and Top 10 Street Machines
7. Obtain, prepare (and engrave where necessary) all NZHRA trophies which include:
 - a. Top Hot Rod
 - b. Top Street Machine
 - c. Top Participant
 - d. Ron Lough Memorial Trophy – Best Represented Club
 - e. Ron Short Memorial Trophy – Best Participating Family
 - f. Best Traditional Hot Rod
8. Goody bags
9. People on gates/doors/selling programmes
10. Hiring EFTPOS machine
11. Security
12. Outdoor display for non-entered and club display cars
13. Printing people's choice forms and voting forms

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING AWARDS

1. Long Distance

To be based on the number of kilometres travelled, not including Cook Strait, in the straightest possible route.

2. Ron Lough Memorial – Best Participating Club Shield

To be awarded to the NZHRA Member Club who has the greatest number of eligible vehicles in attendance, not the highest number of entrants. This would normally be determined from the host club(s) entry list database. This award is to be presented by an NZHRA Official.

3. Ron Short Memorial – Best Participating Family Shield

To be determined jointly by NZHRA and the host club(s) and awarded to the family who has been noticeably the most actively involved in all facets of the event. This award is to be presented by an NZHRA Official.

4. Best Traditional Hot Rod

To be determined by the NZHRA Officials in attendance and awarded to the vehicle which best reflects the criteria set down by NZHRA for the category - *cars meeting the 'Traditional' criteria are decided on amongst all eligible vehicles.* This award is to be presented by an NZHRA Official.

At the request of the event host, NZHRA may assist the officials with the determination of other awards.

ELIGIBILITY

For a vehicle to be entered in an NZHRA sanctioned event, the entrant must belong to an NZHRA affiliated Club and be in possession of a current NZHRA affiliation card and a sticker displayed on the vehicle's window. These numbered current affiliation cards are forwarded to each club upon receipt of member affiliation fees. A corresponding NZHRA sticker should be attached to the windscreen.

All vehicles belonging to NZHRA members entering the event must have a current warrant of fitness and registration displayed, certified under LVVTA Certification program and must carry a Certification Plate/Disc. Stock class cars must display a NZHRA Stock sticker on windscreen.

OVERSEAS ENTRANTS

All cars entered by overseas entrants are required to comply with all Government Land Transport regulations necessary for that/those vehicle(s) temporary use on NZ roads.

Overseas cars will not be eligible to take part in any competitive driving skill events or be eligible for NZHRA awards.

Overseas guests without vehicles can be entered as a passenger with NZHRA member entrants.

DRIVING EVENTS

Ensure that 'what is required' in terms of the event safety, drivers behaviour etc is clearly available for organiser and participants to view.

The course(s) must be in accordance with the Sanctioning Approval and the events are to be conducted in a safe manner with due regard to potential vehicle speed and spectator safety.

POINT COLLATION

NZHRA Officials may assist event hosts with the collation of points relating to Top 10 Hot Rods, Top 10 Street Machines, Top Participant and general assistance in any other areas of prize awarding including help to establish Best Represented Club, Long Distance, Hard Luck etc.

One voting form per entered vehicle with 10 votes for Top 10 Hot Rod and 10 votes for Top 10 Street Machine. See Sample on page 8.

It is the responsibility of the NZHRA Official to ensure that all vehicles and/or vehicle owners are eligible for the prizes they are to receive, in terms of current affiliation, vehicle regulatory and Certification requirements and check for modifications etc where necessary.

PRIZE GIVING

NZHRA will provide advice to the host club(s) in relation to the prize giving procedure if required. The NZHRA Official involved should ensure that the following matters are addressed:

1. By arrangement with the event hosts before prize giving ceremonies it should be ensured that:
 - a. That NZHRA's contribution is acknowledged
 - b. That the order of awards are appropriate
 - c. That the Top Participant award emphasis is not overstated beyond that given to Top Hot Rod and Top Street Machine
 - d. Any other points that seem relevant at the time

2. During the prize giving ceremonies it will be the duty of an NZHRA Official, usually the President to present the NZHRA awards:
 - a. The Ron Lough Memorial – Best Participating Club Shield
 - b. The Ron Short Memorial – Best Participating Family Shield
 - c. NZHRA Best Traditional Vehicle Trophy
 - d. Top Hot Rod
 - e. Top Street Machine
 - f. Top Participant
 - g. To assist the event host club(s) with the presentation ceremonies in any way they require

TIMELINE

18 MONTHS

- Contact Zone Director
- Sanction event
- Organise an Event Committee
- Draw up a complete Safety Plan

12-18 MONTHS

- Secure venue
- Seek/Secure sponsors.

6-12 MONTHS

- Poster & T-shirt design
- Advertising
- Trade Stalls
- Finalise entry forms, itinerary and any driving events
- Apply to NZHRA for grant of up to \$15000. Application must be on club letterhead, signed by no less than three currently affiliated club committee members and include a proposed budget
- Organise security

3-6 MONTHS

- Organize transport/ sightseeing for entrants
- Organize trophies including keepsakes
- Send entry forms and itinerary

0-3 MONTHS

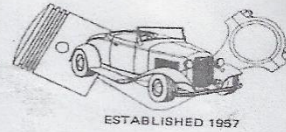
- 2 Months - Advise entrants of acceptance
- After close off date send list of entrants to NZHRA office to confirm they are currently a financial affiliated member

POST SHOW

- Send finalised budget expenditure to office within 6 months of event closing
- Send full list of trophy winners to office
- Committee debrief.

WELCOME TO THE CLASSIC COVER INSURANCE NZHRA STREET ROD NATIONALS 2023

Our artwork for the upcoming Nationals features two significant cars. The first was one of the country's top early rods. It was first built by Rich Blandford around 1960 based on a 1930 A roadster. From here it was sold to Lennie Smithers in Auckland and rebuilt again and became named "Black Deuce". It was also used heavily to promote NZHRA. Around the mid-sixties it was bought by Gary Sword and Pete Barnett and was renamed the G.P. Deuce and was turned into a magnificent show car. It featured a 6 carb Chev Corvette engine, 8 chrome lake pipes, candy red paint. It was continually detailed until the early seventies. It travelled to Autorama in Christchurch now with lace paint added. It was here it was photographed for the first series of Weetbix hot rod cards and was also featured on the cover of N.Z. Hot Rod. The first street rod nationals in 1973 it was still one of the top cars. Terry Ferguson bought it and fully rebuilt it with jag rear end, full bonnet and painted it blue. He sold it to England never to be seen again.

The second car is also rich in early New Zealand history having been extensively campaigned at many North Island dirt tracks by Ed Jensen. Once owned by 'Grease' Martin, he sold it to fellow Riverside Rodders member John Allen. The build was out of this world and took 20 years and was featured in N.Z Hot rod (also on the cover) March 09 and has been on the show circuit now for nearly 25 years. It has won many awards at all shows including the Street Rod Nationals against arch-rival Bruce Carter the car is still perfect and as always in line for well-deserved recognition. We have come a long way in 50 years.

RICCARTON RACECOURSE EASTER WEEKEND APRIL 6TH – 10TH 2023

FROM THE ORGANISING COMMITTEE ZONE 9 CLUBS

Welcome to the 2023 **Classic Cover Insurance** NZHRA Street Rod Nationals in Christchurch the garden city.

In the past 50 years the NZHRA Street Rod Nationals have been held three times in Christchurch, the highly successful and massive (1000 people) QE2 event in 1994 the 2001 event held at Riccarton Racecourse and most recently in 2019 event held at Riccarton Racecourse also hosted by Zone 9 Clubs. All have been memorable events for Hot Rodders from around the country that were in attendance.

The 2023 event again utilises the **Riccarton Racecourse** venue as our base and show location.

Our artwork for the upcoming Nationals features two significant cars. The first was one of the country's top early rods. It was first built by Rich Blandford around 1960 based on a 1930 A roadster. From here it was sold to Lennie Smithers in Auckland and rebuilt again and became named "Black Deuce". It was also used heavily to promote NZHRA. Around the mid-sixties it was bought by Gary Sword and Pete Barnett and was renamed the G.P. Deuce and was turned into a magnificent show car. It featured a 6 carb Chev Corvette engine, 8 chrome lake pipes, candy red paint. It was continually detailed until the early seventies. It travelled to Autorama in Christchurch now with lace paint added. It was here it was photographed for the first series of Weetbix hot rod cards and was also featured on the cover of N.Z. Hot Rod. The first street rod nationals in 1973 it was still one of the top cars. Terry Ferguson bought it and fully rebuilt it with jag rear end, full bonnet and painted it blue. He sold it to England never to be seen again.

The second car is also rich in early New Zealand history having been extensively campaigned at many North Island dirt tracks by Ed Jensen. Once owned by 'Grease' Martin, he sold it to fellow Riverside Rodders member John Allen. The build was out of this world and took 20 years and was featured in N.Z Hot rod (also on the cover) March 2009 and John and Family have been on the show circuit with it now for nearly 25 years. It has won many awards at all shows including the Street Rod Nationals against arch-rival Bruce Carter, the car is still perfect and as always in line for well-deserved recognition. We have come a long way in 50 years.

We hope you enjoy your stay in Christchurch and wish you safe travels.
